

Help Kiwanis Grow, Reap Recruitment Rewards

When you recruit new members into Kiwanis, you reward the organization with that new member's fresh ideas, abilities, service hands and enthusiasm. In turn, Kiwanis can reward you with special recruitment honors, incentives and prizes.

Three Kiwanis International programs exist to reward Kiwanians who take the initiative to increase Kiwanis membership. They are summarized below and described in detail on the Kiwanis International Web site, www.kiwanis.org.

1-2-3 You Hold the Key

Runs through June 1, 2007. Recruit one new member and you receive a bronze lapel key and an entry into a random prize drawing. Recruit two new members and receive a silver key and a second entry. Recruit three new members and receive a gold key and a third entry. Gold key holders will also get special recognition at the 2007 Kiwanis International Convention.

Distinguished Member Honors

Runs through June 1, 2007. To qualify as a 2006-2007 Distinguished Member, you must:

- Recruit at least two new members into Kiwanis.
- Participate in two service projects.
- Attend both the Midyear and District Convention (or equivalent).

Distinguished members will receive a lapel pin and recognition at the 2007 Kiwanis International Convention.

Ruby K Award

By recruiting five or more new members during your Kiwanis career, you are eligible for the Ruby K Award. Ruby K pins are available for recruiting 5, 10, 15, 20, 30, 40, and so on, up to 100 new members, and in multiples of 25 over 100. The award is cumulative. so you are eligible for a new Ruby K pin when you recruit additional members.

There is at least one Kiwanian who holds a 4-digit Ruby K pin! Think about that.
